

Synopsis

Jerry Butlerâ™s Only the Strong Survive presents a portrait of a remarkable performer, as well as an up-close and personal look at the world of rhythm-and-blues. Filled with intimate anecdotes about such R&B legends as Otis Redding, Curtis Mayfield, Patti LaBelle, Sam Cook, and Dionne Warwick, Butlerâ™s compelling, sometimes hilarious, narrative is told against the backdrop of 1960s America. Only the Strong Survive, as told to Earl Smith, is an autobiography; but more than that, it is history. Drawing on countless conversations and interviews with Butler and others, Smith chronicles the "Icemanâ™s" journey from rural Mississippi to Chicago, and the founding and eventual breakup of the legendary Impressions vocal group. Currently serving his fourth term on the Cook County Board of Commissioners, Butler also gives us a glimpse inside the world of Chicago politics. He shares stories of Harold Washington, Chicagoâ™s first African American mayor, and others, including Nation of Islam leader Louis Farrakhan. Only the Strong Survive is an entertaining, moving chronicle of one of Americaâ™s music pioneers.

I've been a fan of Jerry Butler for more than a half century. Growing up on Chicago's South Side in the '50's and 60's, I was struck by how much of his story about the groups, the music, the venues and Chicago's music scene, even the record industry, all resonated with me. He sort of downplays his entry into the business world with a beer distributorship, something that piqued my interest since, in Chicago, that can be a lucrative business. I wanted more on that as well as his venturing into politics. Jerry Butler is a remarkable man and his story is most interesting to those of us, black and non-black alike, who grew up on that thriving music scene. The book has an older copyright date than I expected but even with the passage of well over a decade the story still plays well.

A friend of mine gave me "Only the Strong Survive" as a Christmas gift, and now I treasure it as one of the best gifts I've ever received. This is more than a book about music--although eighty percent of it is. It is a history book, political book, inspirational book -- you name it! One would never think that a rhythm and blues singer had that much depth. For example, Mr. Butler uses the tragic case of his former bongo player to show the horrors of the war in Vietnam. Then, turning to politics, he reminds us of the debt we owe the late Congressman Adam Clayton Powell, and what all of us can do to make this world a better place. It is at once inspirational and entertaining, thought-provoking and profound -- a must-read for all serious readers!
